- an ability to analyse and respond to specific cases especially those most common in Catholic health and aged care;
- access to resources to assist in addressing ongoing ethical challenges.

About the Course

The eight-session course will:

- be based on the principles of adult learning and best practice online pedagogy;
- incorporate multi-media content from experts around Australia;
- integrate ethical principles via case studies and the day-to-day experience of participants;
- support ethical practice in both the clinical and wider organisational environment;
- foster reflective practice;
- require approximately two hours per session to complete (around 16 hours total);
- be uploaded fortnightly over a four month period;
- offer access to feedback and group learning via a tutor and online learning community.

Xavier Symons is a Research Associate in the Institute for Ethics and Society, University of Notre Dame Australia. He is also PhD candidate with the Centre for Moral Philosophy and Applied Ethics at the Australian Catholic University. Xavier's research interests range from ethical issues at the beginning and end of life, to conscientious objection in medicine and the role of religion in medical practice. He also has an interest in Catholic social teaching and the ethics of healthcare resource allocation. He will shortly submit his PhD thesis, which focuses on the allocation of lifesaving healthcare resources.

Xavier has taught Catholic Social Teaching and bioethics at the ACU for several years, and has worked with the Catholic healthcare sector on several projects related to ethics education. Xavier has also had significant international research exposure. In 2018, Xavier was awarded the first annual Pellegrino Young Scholar's Essay Prize, and award administered by the Pellegrino Centre for Clinical Bioethics at Georgetown University. He was also the recipient of the 2018 Archbishop Mannix Travelling Scholarship – an award that he is using to complete a Master of Studies in Practical Ethics at the University of Oxford. From February 2016 to January 2019, Xavier was a lay member of the Austin Hospital's Human Research Ethics Committee. He is also a regular contributor to the online bioethics news-service BioEdge.
